Curators K Ryan Henisey and Eugene Huffman present a multi-artist showcase with My Youth. The exhibition, open to artists who identify as LGBTQIA, focuses on growing up queer. "One of the goals of this show was to amplify Queer artists and expression" says Henisey. Our focus on each person's experience allows us to highlight a variety of stories and voices. And what we found is a beautiful, oftentimes haunted but equally triumphant, expression of each artist's youth."

Paintings, photographs, mixed media assemblage, and more come together in My Youth. The collection expands upon Queer themes of hybridity and fragmentation. The result is full of passion, revealing hardships and victories universal to all. When you create art, you are storytelling," Huffman expounded. "It's the same with curating. Having the chance to review a broad body of Queer work is rewarding enough. But in My Youth, we've woven a visual tapestry, carrying threads of dissonance throughout."
